Dave Sweeney Elected EVFC President

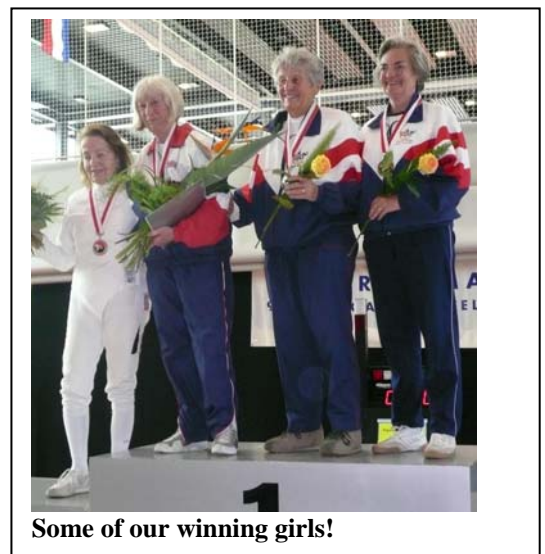

Important Information for our WEB users

PDF Documents

Newsletters, and our event information sheets, are published as Word documents and as PDF documents. I distinguish the format by using different logos for Word and for the PDF version:  

What is the difference in the two formats?

As a user you have to have a modern copy of Microsoft Word installed on your computer. If your computer is a Mac, you cannot read Word documents.

You have to have a PDF reader program installed on your computer to read PDF documents but the reader software is free.

What is the difference between the document formats?

PDF documents tend to be smaller than the equivalent Word document so the opening delay is shorter. But

the major benefit is that PDF documents always look the same whereas a Word document can look different if you have different Word setting to those of the author. This is a particular problem in complex page layouts.

I would like to change so that we only publish in PDF format.

What do you have to do?

Can you open a PDF file already? Click on this [link](#) and see if you can open a newsletter file. If you see the newsletter then you are already set up and there is nothing to do.

Otherwise, you should download a (free) PDF reader.

The standard is [Adobe](#). Click on this link to locate the version suitable for your computer and to download the software.

If you have a PC with the Windows operating system, an alternative program is FoxIt PDF Reader. This

has the advantage of being smaller to download and quicker in use. There are detailed instructions on how to install this program on the NVA website. Download the [Foxit PDF Reader](#). I have been using this program for a couple of years and, touch wood, it seems to be reliable.

At some point, I would like to discontinue the practice of publishing Word documents and publish only PDF documents. It will make the website look a little less cluttered by getting rid of the Word icon. It also ensures that all our readers are seeing exactly the same document.

Please let me know if you have any difficulty installing and using a PDF reader. I shall make the full transition to PDF at some point in the next year, perhaps after the AGM in March.

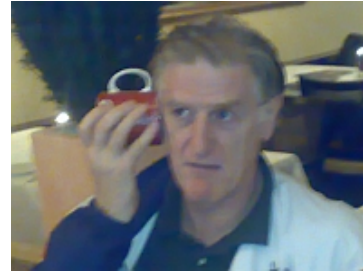
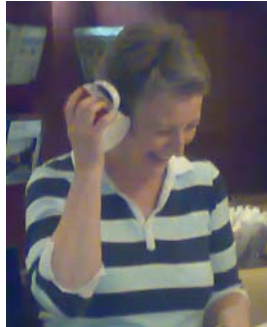
You went to the competition and your mask/weapon/jacket failed!

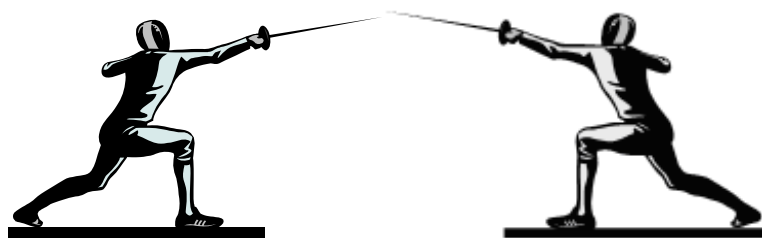


WINTON CUP NEWS and a question?
