

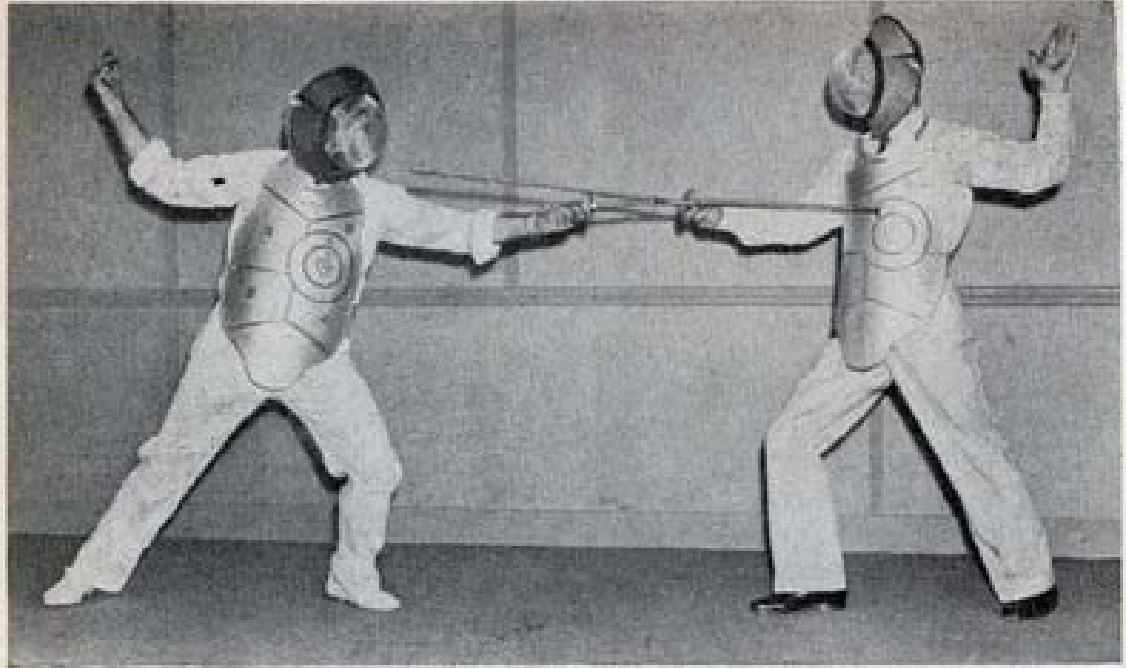

Vacuum Cups Keep Score for Fencers

VACUUM CUPS of rubber fixed lightly to the ends of foils are a feature of a novel fencing outfit just introduced. The tiny cups come loose and stick to an opponent's protective shield at the point where they touch it. The tips not only

insure safety for the fencers, but facilitate scoring by adhering to areas appropriately marked on the shields. Scoring is based on the location of the touch, a thrust at the heart counting most.

European Team Championships – Ciudad Real, Spain 8-11 May 2008

The following selections have been made, based on the NVA selection rules (available on the NVA website or by request to the NVA Secretary).

Please note:

1. The European Team Championships have an aggregate age rule: 150 for men's teams and 135 for women's teams.
2. Each weapon team comprises 3 fencers + 1 substitute.
3. Substitutes participate as team members but should note that **there is no guarantee of fencing**. Composition of the teams starting each match, plus any subsequent substitution, will be decided by the weapon captain and is generally based on fielding the strongest team.
4. Selection is subject to the NVA appeals process. Any appeal should be sent to Frank Mills by email or in writing (see front of newsletter for contact details), to arrive no later than 2 April 2008.
5. **Fencers must confirm their intention to accept their place(s)**. Acceptances should be sent to Frank Mills, by email or in writing, to arrive **ASAP but no later than 2 April 2008**. Any team place not confirmed by this date will be offered to another fencer. (NB: Non-travelling reserves are notified separately after the cut-off date for acceptances, as the age of a fencer dropping out may impact on selection restrictions.)
6. Travel costs (flight to Madrid & train to Ciudad Real) are estimated at £160 return.

Responses will be sorted by weapon, and weapons will be treated differently if appropriate. In the event of any difference of viewpoint between participants and non-participants, greater weight will be given to the views of participants.

All members have been circulated with a copy. Further copies are available on the website, or by SAE to Hilary Arnold.

All feedback will be welcome: please continue on a second sheet if you wish to make any comments.

If the results of the questionnaire lead to a change of format, a review of the new system's impact on selection will be carried out by the committee, and the results published well before the 2009 National Championships.

Please note: a return will be deemed to be spoilt if it is illegible, or if it does not bear the name of a current NVA member.
