9th European Team Championships – Ciudad Real, Spain

The event was overshadowed by the sad death of Ivo van Seters, the Belgium Official, who collapsed shortly after the competition had started, but the Belgium team bravely made the decision to continue knowing that was what he would have wanted them to do.

Great Britain fielded a full team at all six weapons in this, the 9th European Team Championships. Some won medals, some came closer than the final results indicate, but every single team member fought well and hard and did our country and the NVA proud.

First on the piste was our team of Men's Foil with Tim Miles, Tony Bartlett, Brian Causton and Paul Lowen with 11 other teams competing at the weapon.

After a close match with Hungary, where we lost 5-4, the team went on to meet the Czech Republic and achieved an 8-1 win. France was next in the first round of DE , and the team were beaten 5-2. This was thought to be the end of fencing for the team, but the organisers decided that all places needed to be fought out, and a further two matches saw us win 5-2 against Spain and lose 5-3 to Germany.

Men's Foil final places were Italy 1st, Hungary 2nd and Russia 3rd with GB 6th.

Then came the turn of Women's Sabre with our team of Jane Hutchison, Sue Benney, Jenny Morris and Kate Morwell-Neave. In the first match against Russia, we emerged victorious with a 5-4 win, but then lost to France by 5-4.

We met Russia again in the DE and secured a 5-2 win, and a repeat 5-2 win in the DE against Italy.

The match for Gold and Silver could not have been closer and with the score at 4 fights each, and with the piste surrounded by supporters from both countries, Sue Benney overcame her opponent to get the deciding hit and the gold medal for Great Britain. A truly marvellous result and very well earned by all members of the team.

Saturday saw the Women's Foil and Men's Epee competitions. Our team for Women's Foil comprised Jo Bowyer, Gillian Worman, Jenny Morris and Hilary Philbin. The 9 team competition was divided into poules for the first round, with GB fighting Germany and Ukraine. Our first match was against a very strong team from Germany and we were defeated 8-1. The Ukrainians then withdrew from the competition due to injury, as they had only three fencers with no substitute, and the rules demand that a team comprise three fencers.

This was extremely bad news for Great Britain as we had no chance to gain further

indicator points to assist us in the DE draw, whilst the German team had already achieved good points from their match against us.

We then had the misfortune to draw Germany in the first round of DE and were able to take no further part after a 5-1 defeat, as the organisers decided to run the whole event to the rule that only the top 4 teams would fence for the results.

Italy were 1st, Germany 2nd and Russia 3rd with Great Britain placed 7th.

The Men's Epee team were Howard West, Neal Mallett, Ralph Johnson and Keith Barnett and they achieved 7-2 wins against both Norway and Portugal, and a close 4-5 defeat against Russia.

Going in to the DE with 16 teams taking part, we were seeded 5th and achieved a 5-0 win against Belgium only to be defeated by the Russian team 5-2. This gave us 5th place overall, with Ukraine 1st, Germany 2nd, Italy 3rd and Russia 4th.

Sunday saw the turn of the Women's Epee with 10 teams, and Men's Sabre with 10 teams. The Women's Epee team were Kate Smith, Kate Morwell-Neave, Jenny Morris and Lynne Bornemisza.

The poule saw a 1-8 defeat against Germany, and a close 4-5 defeat against Norway but a good 5-1 win against Spain took us to the second round of DE where we met France. This we lost 2-5 and achieved 8th place overall. Germany went on to win the competition with France 2nd and Finland 3rd.

The Men's Sabre team of Chris Prevett, Richard Bonehill, Steve Potter and Carl Morris, had 9 other teams to contend with in the competition and secured wins against Hungary and Poland in the poule and a narrow loss of 4-5 against Germany.

A good 5-4 win against Italy in the first DE took us into the last 4, but a 3-5 defeat against Germany meant we were fighting it out with Belgium for the bronze medal. Our team beat them 5-1 to give us our second medal of the Championships.

This was my first solo outing as Team Manager, and it was a great pleasure to work with every member of the squad who put their all into every fight, and ensured that Great Britain maintains a leading position in international veterans' fencing.

Finally our thanks must go to our referees; Pat Casey, Duncan Rowlands and Carl Morris who worked extremely hard throughout the competition, and gave impartial advice to me and the team members whenever it was needed.

Dear Frank!

1) History

Our club has the name SKA-FC - which could be interpreted as a fencing club (or actually a team) of Saint-Petersburg Sporting Club of Russian Armed Forces (SKA)). In fact in SKA we cultivate men's foil and veterans' epee

The coming tournament would be the second one. The very first took place also in Saint Petersburg on the 06-07 of October 2007, just after the World championship. The participants were: two veteran teams from Sweden, one team from Finland and two -from Russia. The tournament was named after our coach, bronze medalist of the Olympic games in Melbourne and an active supporter of veteran fencing in Saint-Petersburg, Mr. Alexander Vetrov

2) This year's event details

Our club SKA-FC invited again the Finns, Swedes and your fencers. The rules, which we tried last year (and plan to implement this year too) were as follows;

Each team consists of three fencer regardless of a gender. Minimum age of the fencer - 40 years. (No aggregated age limit for the team would be applied). Weapon - epee.

The date of the event - 01 and 02 of November, 2008. Venue - Saint - Petersburg, Russia

Every team participating will fence against all other participating teams. Every bout will be fenced 3 min+ 1 extra if needed, 5touches.All bouts in the match would be fenced.

The competition starts with the members of one team fencing with each other. After that the team will continue with the opponent team. So, when all matches of the event will be over , we will have results for individuals as well.. The best four fencers will have a direct elimination stage to define the individual winner. (10 touches, 2periods by 3 min)

3) Miscellaneous

We would provide the fencing hall and the equipment, Refreshments on the premises. **No participation fee.**

We recommend to apply for the normal tourist entry visa to Russia, although we can send non-official invitation letter to provide the participants with more details for visa application.

We can help with airport or railway station transfer and some spare time program, if needed. If somebody wishes us to book a hotel - we are ready to assist, but one should keep in mind that not all hotels may be accepted by the Russian Embassy to grant a visa. From last year experience I remember that after all, the Swedes just went to the travel agency. So did the Finns.

Dear Member,

I have been contacted by the family of Zsolt Vadaszffy to say that after a short illness, Zsolt died peacefully on the morning of Saturday 3 May 2008.

Many of us remember Zsolt from his days as assistant coach to Professor Steve Boston at Salle Boston in the sixties and seventies and since then being involved in coaching at his own Club in south London. I managed to get hold of my copy of Richard Cohen's history of Salle Boston - typed up but never printed - and looked up Zsolt's background. He fled from Hungary in 1956, the year of the uprising, fenced as an amateur for a while, and then approached Steve Boston in 1964, asking to train under him. In 1969, Zsolt was the only one of a record 12 candidates to pass his provost examination. Like Steve he also dabbled with boxing - and with the Entertainment Industry where he had been offered several film parts. Teddy Bourne, Ralph Johnson, Chris Green, John Fairhall, Benny Pitman, Derek Russell, Steve Lennox, Robin Davenport, Edmund Gray and many others passed through his hands in that little primary school building off Warren Street. I, particularly, remember him as very much my own mentor during those days at Salle Boston and being a firm but fair taskmaster. We kept in touch over the years and he often came along to the Royal Tournament at Earls Court to watch the Inter Services Fencing Finals and stayed with us in Belgium on a number of occasions. He will be sadly missed.

His funeral will be held at the West Herts. Crematorium, Garston, London WD25 0JF on Friday 16 May at 2pm. All are welcome to attend.

He leaves a wife, Irena, and two children, Karl and Angelique.
